



Martin Luther King Jr. Day is a federal holiday in the United States celebrating the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The holiday is observed on the third Monday of January each year; Dr. King's actual birthday is January 15. The first holiday was observed in January, 1986.

Dr. King was one of the most prominent leaders in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. He led the movement to end segregation and counter prejudice in the United States through the means of peaceful protest and nonviolence.

Dr. King participated in and led marches for the right to vote, desegregation, labor rights and other civil rights. He oversaw the 1955 Montgomery bus boycott and later became the first president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Dr. King was one of the leaders of the 1963 March on Washington, where he delivered his "I Have a Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.
