# **Interested in Learning More About COASL Services?**

Are you curious about the programs and services offered by the Council on Aging of St. Lucie (COASL)? Whether you are looking for information on social activities, nutritious food programs, in-home care, or our Adult Day Care services, the COASL Consumer Services Department is here to help.

Our team is available to answer your questions about the daily on-site congregate meal program, Meals on Wheels, in-home support, and much more. We also work closely with seniors and their caregivers to understand individual needs and provide appropriate referrals.

In addition, Consumer Services administers the Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program (EHEAP). This program offers help with past-due electric bills for households in St. Lucie County with at least one resident aged 60 or older who meets income eligibility requirements. Please note: EHEAP assistance is based on available funding.

Recently, we have seen how current socio-economic issues have been affecting seniors. Over the course of one day, we had several seniors seeking assistance due to homelessness and other concerns. One senior was homeless, caring for her disabled adult daughter. Our staff was able to direct these individuals to services that might offer help. But this highlighted the needs that our seniors face: food insecurities, homelessness, health and mental wellness concerns.

While attending meetings where other non-profit agencies are present, the realization comes that "we are all chasing the same \$\$\$"!
